Lib Dems poll 55% of Broadstone votes Turnout reaches 56%

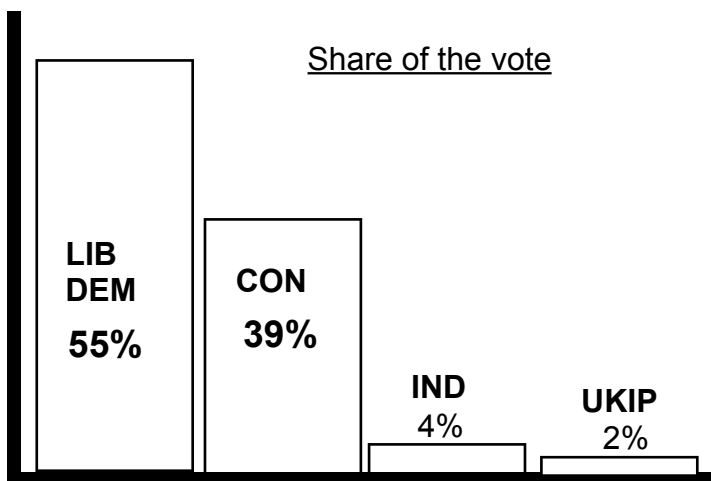

Our First 10 days...

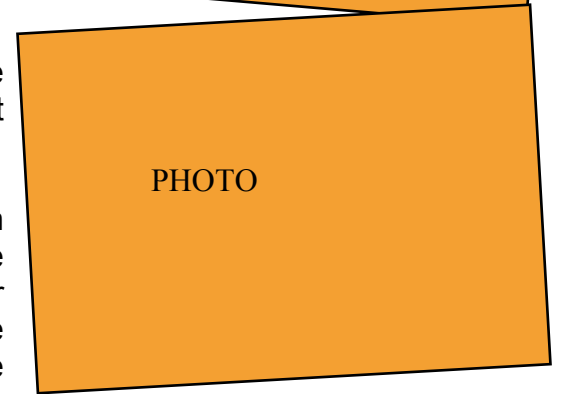
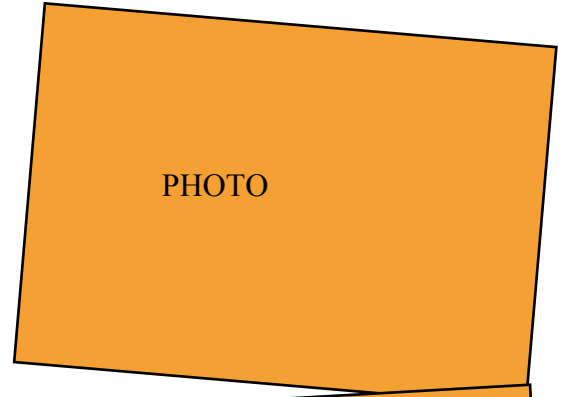
We picked up a number of issues as we knocked on doors during our recent election campaign. Many of these relate to road safety, traffic problems, and overdevelopment. Probably the two most significant of these reflected people's concerns over the recent fatal accidents on the Broadway and on Broadstone Way. We have therefore asked the officers to look into the feasibility of restricting the speed through the Broadway to 20mph. and of introducing traffic lights at the junction of Broadstone Way with Beechbank Avenue.

Heavy goods vehicles and speeding traffic are again causing concern on Higher Blandford Road. These issues are to be discussed at the next Area Committee meeting at the end of May. (See below for details)

We have already contacted the Council's senior public transport officer regarding the quality of bus services and we will continue to press for gaps in the service to be filled.

The council is to spend £5,000 assessing the need for bus stops on Broadstone Way in the vicinity of PC World/B&Q. There are no plans to provide stops near the Beechbank Avenue junction which could serve residents in the Pinesprings-West Way area.

The 2007/09 capital programme for roads has just been released and the news is mixed for Broadstone. Subsidence on Pinesprings Drive will be addressed during this financial year and at long last Clarendon Road and Bognor Road will be resurfaced – though not until 2008/9. No other roads are scheduled for repair.
